






Ghost Orchid By Fiona Lumbers Go my little one, swim free, she whispered. I'll always be waiting here . . .



Do You Love Oceans? - Matt Robertson

The **Do You Love?** series takes a deep dive into the world's oceans to introduce young readers to some of the wonderful creatures that live there and inform them about threats to the watery world from mankind. The pages on coral reefs for example, illustrates and names different types of coral, as well as the fish that live there and later the book explains the impact of warming oceans on coral reefs and the steps being taken to protect them.
